

Life Saving Defib Installed

The Bureau, The Masonic Lodge Councillor Damien Greenhalgh and Glossopdale School all funded and pushed for a life saving defibrillator to be fitted outside The Bureau on Henry Street to ensure the best chances of survival if a member of public suffered a cardiac arrest. The Masonic Lodge very kindly funded the security locked heated yellow cabinet and councillor Greenhalgh along with Glossopdale School generously funded the defibrillator.

In the UK there are over 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests (OHCA) a year where emergency medical services attempt to resuscitate the victim. However, the survival rate is low – just 1 in 10 people in the UK survive an OHCA.

After some struggles with getting permission to fit the device onto the wall of The Bureau, due to a potential hazard of people walking into it, Hartleys Garden Centre provided a beautiful wooden planter full with colourful flowers which now sits directly under the defib.

The Bureau will pay for routine maintenance and checks to keep it in working order in case the worst was to happen.

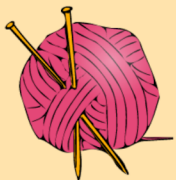
