



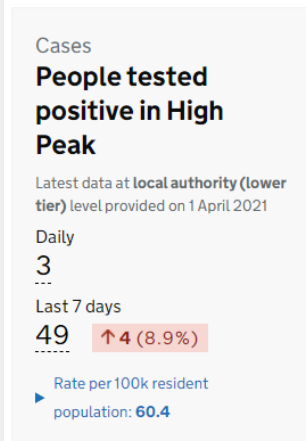

### Home Testing Kits for Parents and Bubbles in Glossopdale

## CORONAVIRUS TEST KITS FOR PARENTS AND CHILDCARE BUBBLES AVAILABLE AT GLOSSOPDALE

If you have children at school, you can now pick up coronavirus home test kits from the car park at Glossopdale School every Saturday and Sunday from 9am to 3pm.

The kits are to test family members, and members of any childcare bubbles. You can have two packs of seven tests.

With around one in three of those with coronavirus having no symptoms, regular testing to help to protect the whole family and those you work with.

## Vaccine Milestone!



Tameside and Glossop's Covid vaccination drive has reached a major milestone with over 100,000 residents across Tameside and Glossop now having received their life-saving jab. This significant figure has been reached in just three months and with second doses also now being provided it means even more jabs have been given. It's anticipated that by the end of April all of the first phase priority groups 1 to 9, which includes all over 50s, defined clinically extremely

vulnerable individuals and adults aged 18-65 in an at-risk group, will have been vaccinated in Tameside and Glossop, dependent on vaccine delivery.

## Roadmap Update

This week saw the next stage in the government roadmap. Here's what has changed:

- You can now meet up to 6 people or 2 separate households (of any number of people) outdoors, in public spaces or in private gardens.
- Outdoor sports facilities such as tennis and basketball courts, and open-air swimming pools, can now open and people can take part in formally organised outdoor sports.
- The 'stay at home' rule has now ended but we are asked to 'stay local'.

It is still important to remain vigilant and careful, despite these changes. Ensure you keep your distance, even outdoors, and wash your hands regularly!

The next stage in the roadmap is scheduled for the 12<sup>th</sup> April or later, which will see further reopening of retail, personal care, gyms and outdoor attractions.
