Virus Case Numbers in High Peak

Here is the current Covid-19 data for Glossopdale for the previous 7 days, compared to the 7 days previous.

This is another week on week rise. Remember - Anyone who has been contacted by test & trace or with any of the three main symptoms of Covid-19 **must self-isolate immediately** for 10 days, even if your home testing kit says you are negative. The three main symptoms are:

- A new, continuous cough
- A high temperature
- A loss or change to their sense of smell or taste

Self-Isolation Eased for Fully Vaccinated Adults in Step 4

From 16th August, double jabbed individuals and under 18s will no longer need to self-isolate if they are identified as a close contact of someone with Covid-19. Read more [here](#).

What Are The Rules on Wearing Face Masks?



As the country moves into step four of the easing of lockdown, the government is removing COVID-19 prevention measures and is asking people to take personal responsibility for keeping themselves and others safe from infection.

Face coverings will no longer be required by law, but the government said it "expects and recommends that people wear face coverings in crowded areas such as public transport".

Many transport operators have said that they expect and encourage users to wear face masks, along with many of the big supermarkets such as Tesco, Sainsbury's, Asda, Morrisons and Aldi.

Many businesses are simply asking people to make personal decisions regarding face masks but will keep some social distancing measures in place, such as screens at tills and ordering at tables in pubs.

Considering the rise in numbers in Glossopdale, it would be sensible to continue wearing a face mask in all public indoor spaces.

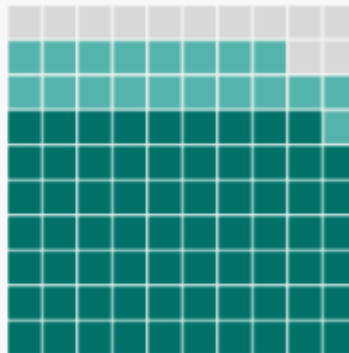
Percentage of adult population

From 3rd August to 31st August 2021, there will be weekly 1st dose Pfizer clinics at Glossop Vaccine Centre at the Cricket Club on North Road. You can book an appointment [here](#) or by contacting your GP.

Over 2000 people in Glossopdale still have not had a vaccine. Get yours now!

The Covid Vaccination Van - Next stop:

If you are eligible simply drop in, **no appointment needed, no ID required.**
For first and second dose (after 8 weeks), Pfizer and AstraZeneca.

Do I Have to Have The Vaccine?

Covid vaccines are not compulsory, but everyone is being urged to get two doses to protect themselves, their family, friends and wider society.

Without a jab you may not be able to do certain jobs, and some countries only allow [fully vaccinated travellers to enter](#).

People with both jabs [don't have to self-isolate on return to the UK from amber list countries](#), with the exception of France.

The government has also said [clubbers and people attending some other venues in England will have to be fully vaccinated](#) by the end of September.
