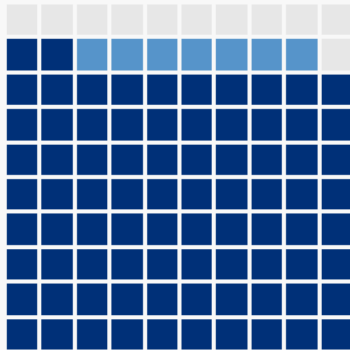

Vaccine Update

Everyone aged 16 and over can now get the COVID-19 vaccine.

Booster Doses

Eligible patients are being contacted by their GPs now to book into the booster vaccine clinics at Glossop Cricket Club. Once you get your text message you can either book online or call the number on the text message. These are not drop in clinics and it's vital that you attend at your appointment time to avoid causing delays.

You can also call the Glossop Health Team enquiry line on 07512998955 if you would like some more information. The line is not manned all week but if you leave a message, they will get back to you.

Tuesday 26th October at Glossop Cricket Club, North Road – 17.30 – 19.30

You can attend these clinics if you are:

- Over the age of 16 and have not had your first vaccine
- Due your second dose (8 weeks after your first)
- Aged 12-15 with underlying health conditions (**You will be contacted if this applies to you**)

Who Can Have the Booster Vaccine?

Under the government's Covid-19 Response: Autumn and Winter Plan, Covid booster vaccines are being offered to about 30 million people, including the over 50s, younger adults with health conditions and frontline health and social care workers.

Who Can Have the Flu Vaccine?

This year the flu jab will be offered to:

- All children who are aged two and three on 31 August 2021
- All children in primary school and all secondary school pupils under the age of 16 on 31 August
- Those aged six months to under 50 years in clinical risk groups
- Pregnant women
- Those aged 50 years and over
- People in residential care
- Unpaid carers
- Close contacts of people with weakened immune systems
- Health and care staff

The flu vaccine will be offered via your GP, local pharmacy and schools. In Glossopdale you will be contacted by your local GP if you are eligible and given information on how to book. The next flu vaccine clinic at Glossop Cricket Club is scheduled on Saturday 9th October.
